The Topic: The talk will trace the development of madrasas in India. By

taking Deoband as an example, I will argue that the colonial context transformed the aims, contents and methods of the madrasas. Without underlining this shift, I believe, it will be difficult to understand the politics of madrasas today. This politics will be explained as an attempt to redefine Muslim identity in India by positioning the madrasas as the guardian

of the Muslim private sphere.
