Quality of Life, Community and Diversity are theme issues present in our daily lives and in different research approaches.

Regarding Quality of Life, Tonon (2007) points out that its study refers to material and psychosocial surroundings, recognizing two spheres of well-being: the social and the psychological, the latter corresponding to experience and assessment people make of their situation, which includes positive and/or negative appreciations and a global vision of their lives, called vital satisfaction.

As to Community, the definition that places geographical space as a key aspect has been modified and at present, according to Maya Jariego (2004), community can be understood as locality and as a relational group, the former referring to neighbourhood, city or a specific rural area and the latter, to interpersonal relations beyond geography. At the same time, the subject of community leads us to reflect on identity and diversity. (Rodriguez de la Vega & Meza, 2009).

Considering the above, the Seminar Course proposes to review these themes and offer an update on research approaches developed in this context at UNI-COM, Faculty of Social Sciences - National University of Lomas de Zamora - Buenos Aires, Argentina.
