Sudha Pai is a well-known political scientist. Her research interests include Dalit Politics, State Politics in India, Agrarian Politics, Globalization and Legislative Governance. She has authored 5 books, 4 edited volumes and 20 twenty chapters in books, apart from articles in reputed national and international journals. She also writes for leading national newspapers. Her most recent book is *Politics in Indian States* (2013).



Ananya Vajpeyi works at the intersection of Intellectual History, Political Theory and Critical Philology. She is currently writing a life of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. She writes a monthly column for The Telegraph, Calcutta, and contributes regularly to The Caravan magazine. Her book, *Righteous Republic: The Political Foundations of Modern India*, was named Book of the Year 2012 by The Guardian and The New Republic. It received the Thomas J. Wilson Memorial Prize from Harvard University Press, the Tata First Book Award for Non-Fiction (2013), and the Crossword Award for Non-Fiction (2013).



Sanjay Kumar is Professor at the Centre for the Study of Developing Societies and Co-Director of Lokniti, a Research Program of the CSDS. He has recently published *Changing Electoral Politics in Delhi: From Caste to Class* (with Praveen Rai) and *Measuring Voting Behaviour in India*. As an expert in Survey Research, he has directed various National and State level studies conducted by the CSDS, which includes the National Election Studies, (NES) 1998, 1999, 2004, and 2009, various rounds of the bi-annual survey, 'State of the Nation Survey', and various State level studies.



Eswaran Sridharan is the Academic Director of the University of Pennsylvania Institute for the Advanced Study of India (UPIASI), New Delhi, from its inception in 1997, and was earlier with the Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi. He is a political scientist with research interests in the Political Economy of Development, Party Systems and Coalition Politics, and International Relations Theory, Conflict Resolution and Cooperation-building in South Asia. His two recent books are *International Relations Theory and South Asia*, *Vols. I & II* (2011), and *Coalition Politics and Democratic Consolidation in Asia* (2012). He has published over fifty-five journal articles and chapters in edited volumes. He is the Editor of *India Review*, a refereed Routledge journal, and is on the Editorial Advisory Board of *Commonwealth and Comparative Politics*.



Balveer Arora is the Honorary Chairman, Centre for Multilevel Federalism, Institute of Social Science, New Delhi. He has served as Rector, Jawaharlal Nehru University from where he retired as Professor, Centre for Political Studies. A leading authority on Federalism and multiple dimensions of Indian Politics, he was awarded Officer of the *Ordre des Palmes Academiques*, by the Government of France in 2003 for distinguished contribution to academics.



Paranjoy Guha Thakurta is an independent journalist and educator. His work experience, spanning over 36 years, cuts across different media: print, radio, television and documentary cinema. He is a writer, speaker, anchor, interviewer, teacher and commentator in three languages: English, Bengali and Hindi.
