A columnist of *Le Monde Diplomatique* (Mexican edition, 1998-2000), Prof. Bogado has contributed scores of articles in different journals and magazines on the right of information, journalistic ethics, politics, communication and law, served on editorial teams and worked in radio and as media consultant on human rights.

Author of *To Shake*, 2006 bestseller in Paraguay, he has co-authored several other books, produced DVD on Corruption in Latin America. A Fullbright Fellow at the University of Minnesota, and Nieman Fellow at the University of Harvard, Prof Bogado was awarded the Order of Academic Excellence by the Colombian Academy of Sciences and Letters.

Prof Bogado will deliver a lecture on "The Future of Radio as a means of communication" at the Mass Communication Research Centre on Oct 26 on the Mass Communication in Latin America at 11.00 a m and will be interviewed by Radio Jamia by Ms Noorin Khan.
