The University Grants Commission has launched a major programme for women in higher education in the academic and administrative streams. The programme planning began with the germination of the idea in 1997 and preparation of training manuals in 1998. Since 2003, training workshops are being held in Universities and Colleges, either for a group of institutions situated in a sub-region (which are residential) or for the departments of the University and affiliated colleges (which are mostly non-residential unless their geographical area is far-flung).

The reason for establishing this activity is the low percentage of women in decision-making positions in Indian universities and colleges. The University Grants Commission has been emphasising gender equity and inclusion in higher education policies and curricula, and this is clearly articulated in the XIth Plan of the UGC. To achieve this objective, one area of concern is the need to increase the number of women in decision-making positions in higher education and develop a gender friendly environment. The above-mentioned scheme invites universities to nominate women holding middle level and higher positions to undergo the training, which extends from five days. In due course, it also identifies some of them as trainers and provides a special skills training workshop to take on the role of coordinators and trainers, so that, they can undertake the responsibility for organising these workshops in their respective institutions.

Jamia had deputed participants for both the workshops. The Local Coordinator has been trained in the workshop for trainers and we have been selected to conduct the workshop. We are responsible for conducting the training for women academicians and administrators at the middle and higher levels in higher education institutions in our geographical area (UP, Uttaranchal, Haryana, NCR), to be held from 24<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> APRIL 2012.

The Coordinator of this Residential UGC Workshop is:

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Nominated women academicians and administrators in the middle or senior level positions in the university system, including principals and teachers in colleges, not necessarily only from women's colleges are to be participants. They could be from any stream including arts, medicine, technology, agriculture, fisheries, pharmacy, architecture, science, commerce, and all other disciplines in our academic institutions. Duty leave is extended for their attendance and the UGC bears all the expenditure as per their approved budget.

The idea is to enhance the University Grants Commission effort to develop gender equity in the management cadres of our institutions as also to have competent women to contribute to the quality of management in higher education.
