

**Short Description:** Screening the Public Sphere: Media and Democracy in India expounds an original social theory of media by positing four concepts — citizenship, public knowledge, criticality and power — as central to an understanding and evaluation of contemporary journalistic practice, ownership patterns and content, while framing the role and relationship of television news with regard to democracy and development. It conceptualizes the media, especially news and information, as fundamental to the debates surrounding its wider implications on the changing nature of democracy, citizenship, political participation, civic engagement and development.

Drawing upon comprehensive empirical data, the *democracy-media-development* relationship is demonstrated through critical analyses of the media's coverage of recent news events. This includes exhaustive content examination of news programmes on all major news channels of India, surveys with media experts and news professionals by way of questionnaires, and interviews with the audience to gauge the impact of media content on their understanding of social, political and economic issues.
